Nye Office Man Dies Suddenly

Funeral services were conducted Sunday afternoon from the Wonocott and Cavanaugh funeral chapel for Cyril W. DeBeltrand, forty-four-year-old employee of the war department office in Tonopah who died suddenly Friday noon. The rites were under the direction of Rev. A. H. MacDonnell, pastor of St. Mark's Episcopal church. Interment took place in the Tonopah cemetery.

A native of Michigan, he was born February 3, 1898. His early life was spent in Michigan and he was educated in the Detroit schools graduating from the Detroit junior college. Prior to moving to Nevada about eleven years ago, he had managed the Central Michigan flying school at Flint.

He first resided in Las Vegas and later lived in Beatty. About four years ago he moved to Silver Peak and for a time was employed as an accountant at the Mary mine. Later he was employed at the navel depot at Hawthorne and recently had been working as an accountant for the war department here.

Surviving relatives include Dr. A. Blinstrub, Nye county physician and health officer, with whom Mr. DeBeltrand made his home here, and his father Elzior DeBeltrand in Michigan.
