Frank A. Barton Dies After Short Illness

"Tonopah - Frank A. Barton, a well known millman, with a record extending over ten years of experience at Goldfield, Millers, Tonopah and Pioneer, died Friday morning at his home in this city, where he arrived a week ago from the Mayflower Mill at Pioneer. The cause of death was acute diabetes, after only one days illness. He is survived by a widow (Mary Ellen Akin Barton, daughter of Charles and Elizabeth Akin), and two sons, Ray, aged seven years and Roy, aged five; and his parents (Guy and Irene Barton) who reside with three other brothers in Long Beach, CA; one brother, Willett Barton, residing in Reno, who happened to be at Searchlight, NV, was appraised of the critical condition of the patient, but did not reach Tonopah until after death. Barton was a son in law of Charles Akin."
