"Tonopah - Stanley Langille, son in law of R. Petroni of the Tonopah Garage, suffered serious injuries yesterday morning when he fell into an abandoned septic tank while crossing the sidewalk to his home. Without warning the ground gave way beneath his weight and he was precipitated to the bottom of a hole sixteen feet deep. In the decent he struck a jutting piece of railroad steel breaking two ribs and possibly causing internal injuries.

Langille disappeared so quickly that his wife who saw him step from his car ran to the door to admit him but could not see any trace or learn of his whereabouts. Suddenly it dawned on her that he had slipped into the hole and with the assistance of neighbors hoisted her husband from the cavity that threatened to become his grave as three large boulders jutting from the wall crashed to the bottom as he was being removed."

13 Feb 1936 Reno Evening Gazette Nye Resident Taken By Death

"Tonopah - Stanley Langille, well known Tonopah automobile dealer, died late yesterday afternoon of pneumonia. He was forty-eight years old.

After coming to Tonopah in 1918 Mr. Langille worked as an automobile mechanic for mining companies and in recent years he operated a garage.

Mr. Langille was born in Massachusetts and received his education in Canada. He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Zelinda Petroni Langille and a seven year old daughter. Funeral services will be held here Saturday afternoon."
