

Birth based on age of 84 years, 7 months at the time of his death.
Prominent mining man of Nevada, died suddenly.

"Mr. Loring began his apprenticeship in the mining industry as a tool boy in Amador County. He was associated with ex-President Hoover in the ownership of the firm of Bewick Moreing & Company, at one time and in 1908 brought out Mr. Hoover's interest. He was responsible for developing the first rapid crushing of ores by stamp mills, and starting numerous operations of great importance to the mining executive Mr. Loring travelled to Australia, England, Japan, Korea, China and India. He came to Tonopah five years ago from San Francisco in hopes of reactivating the Belmont mine and recently had been associated in a tungsten property at Wall Canyon.

Mr. Loring was president of the American Mining Congress in 1920-1921 and contributed many technical papers to the mining press. He was a member of the AIM & ME, many foreign societies, Masonic Blue lodge and Islam Shrine temple, San Francisco.
