"Tonopah - Funeral services were conducted from the Wonacott and Cavanaugh Chapel yesterday afternoon for Paul McQuire, pioneer Tonopah resident, who died suddenly Saturday at Mammoth Lakes. Calif. The last rites were under the direction of Kenneth J. Booth post No. 1103 of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, of which McQuire had been a member in long standing.

Many floral pieces were banked around the casket and scores of friends accompanied the body to the Tonopah Cemetery where interment was made in the Veterans Plot.

McQuire died of acute indigestion. He had been vacationing at Mammoth Lakes and appeared in good health shortly before he was stricken, it is reported.

He had been a resident of Tonopah for the past thirty years and was a mechanic and carpenter. He had worked for several large mining companies in this district. At the advent of the United States into the World War, McQuire enlisted in the 319th engineers. Upon his return to Tonopah he had engaged in the contracting business.
