"Tonopah - Funeral services were held recently for Mrs. Inza Eva Minton, 65, pioneer resident of Tonopah since 1902. Burial in the Tonopah Cemetery followed rites conducted by the Rev. Paul Prichard of the Community Presbyterian Church.

Mrs. Minton, widow of William J. Leary, well known in mining operations until his death in 1936, was widowed again in 1949 on the death of her second husband Ben Hur Minton.

Mrs. Minton came to Tonopah when she was eight years old. She attended schools here and was a past Chief of Argenta Temple, Pythian Sisters Lodge.
