Richard Noonan Dies After Year's Illness

"Tonopah - Richard Noonan, one of the best known miners of the district died Sunday evening at the county hospital where he had been under treatment since July, 1920. The deceased was sixty-seven years of age and came from Massachusetts where he is suppose to have relatives. Noonan had been suffering from a combination of injuries for the past four years which resulted in debility from which he slowly sank to his grave.

The first accident occurred during Christmas week, 1917, when the old man slipped on an icy sidewalk fracturing one thigh. After recovering he was run down by a bobsled at Main and Brougner Streets receiving other fractures which completely crippled him."
