2 Jan 1943 Reno Evening Gazette Mrs. Joseph Roy Dies In Tonopah Funeral Is Held This Afternoon

"Tonopah - Mrs. Helen Fannie Roy, twenty-six, wife of Joseph Roy and mother of five children - the oldest seven - died at noon Wednesday at the Nye County Hospital where she had been a patient for the past eighteen days. She had been in ill health for the past several months and when her condition became critical she was moved to the hospital from her home here.

She was born at Sharp in Eastern Nye County, April 1, 1916, and had spent her entire life in this vicinity. For five years the family made its home at Palmetto where both Mr. and Mrs. Roy were employed by the power company as

substation operators. The family moved to Tonopah last year and resided on Florence Avenue. Survivors include her husband, Joseph Roy; five children, Joseph Alex, Patricia, Robert, Ronald and Francis; grandmother, Mrs. Mary Mouse; three brothers, Johnnie George of Duckwater, Willie George, residing in the east, and Jack George, now in the army; and one sister, Stella Blackeye of Duckwater. Funeral services were held from the Wonacott and Cavanaugh chapel this afternoon at two o'clock. Interment was in the Tonopah Cemetery."
