

" Nick Stanich, 43 years old, died suddenly a few minutes after rising from his bed yesterday morning. The cause of death was acute dilatation of the heart, increased by poor health for several years due to miners phthisis.

Stanich was a veteran of the World War and had been drawing a pension for seventy-five per cent total disability. Physicians warned him to quit mine work but he consistently refused.

The deceased worked at Gold Hill mine living in Round Mountain until Christmas when he moved to Tonopah and leased a piece of the Tonopah Mining Company ground. He was born in 1890 at Brinje, Jugoslavia and was a member of the Young Men's Serbian Society.

Relatives include a sister and relatives in the old country. He was well known in Butte, MT and Roseville, CA"
