Jack Thompson's Life Feared For

"Tonopah - Jack G. Thompson, one of the leading attorneys of Southern Nevada, is in a critical condition at a hospital in San Francisco where he was taken a week ago to be treated for gallstones. After remaining under observation several days an operation was performed Saturday (13 Oct 1923) and it was learned that the seat of the trouble was an abscess of the stomach. Faint hopes of recovery were entertained according to a telegram from Mrs. Thompson, which stated the patient had a fighting chance.

Thompson is president of the Nye County Game Protective Association and has been active in promoting the culture of pheasants in the Southern county. Some years ago he suffered amputation of the right leg on account of injuries sustained by slipping on the ice in front of the Hotel Golden, in Reno. During the Goldfield boom, Thompson was associated with his late brother, I.S. Thompson, and the late Henry B. Morehouse under the firm name of Thompson, Morehouse and Thompson."
