17 Mar 1932 Reno Evening Gazette Funeral Held For J.L. Tracy

"Tonopah - J. L. Tracy, the victim of an accident at the Belmont Mine, was buried in the Tonopah Cemetery yesterday afternoon with six comrades acting as pallbearers, as follows: Salvino Gonzales, Bozo Boscovich, Charles Glenn, W. H. Thomas, Fred Steen and Jack Lee. Services were conducted by Rev. Hugh Huddleson at the mortuary chapel.

The jury empanelled to place responsibility for the death returned the following verdict, We find that the deceased, J. L. Tracy, aged thirty - eight, born in Texas, came to his death by being crushed between the cage and shaft timbers while riding on the cage of the Tonopah Belmont Mining Company, the accident occurred on Sunday between the 1,000 and 1,000 fool levels. We also find that the accident was unavoidable and no one was to blame. This was signed by George Lytle, foreman, Theo Williamson and J. A. Boyland."
